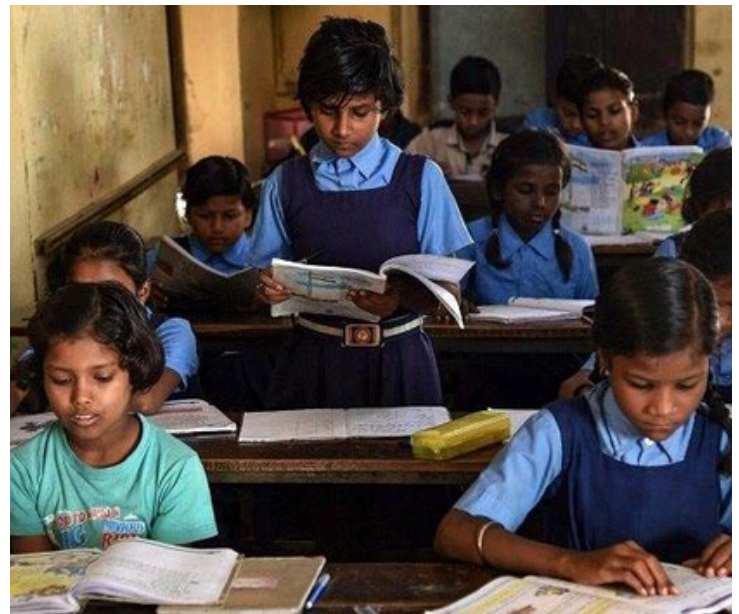


WORLD BANK APPROVES \$500 MILLION FOR 'PROJECT STARS'

The Project 'Stars' which focuses on learning outcomes and prepare students for the jobs of the future. This project will be implemented in Himachal Pradesh, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha and Rajasthan. The world bank has now approved this project worth \$500 million as well. The project, named STARS (Strengthening Teaching-Learning and Results for States Program), will be implemented through the Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, the flagship central scheme. The STARS program builds on the long partnership between India and the World Bank, since 1994, for strengthening public school education and to support the country's goal of providing 'Education for All'. According to a recent report, UNESCO had said that countries including India need to focus on inclusion of students from underprivileged background during the current covid-19 pandemic. the World Bank initiative will focus directly on the delivery of education services at the state, district and sub district levels by providing customized local-level solutions towards school improvement.. **Source: Livemint**

UP GOVERNMENT LAUNCHES A SPECIAL EDUCATION SCHEME

To support the education of the child labourers in the country the UP government has launched a scheme on World day against Child Labour on June 12. Under the scheme, boys will be given Rs 1,000 a month and girls Rs 1,200 so that their family expenses can be met while they pursue their education. For children in classes 8, 9 and 10, an additional sum of Rs 6,000 per year will be provided. While in the first phase, the scheme will cover 2,000 children identified in 57 districts of the state which report the greatest numbers of child labourers, soon it will be extended to children who are extremely vulnerable to being pushed to work, including orphans, children whose parents are unable to work due to disability or disease and children in families that do not own any land. According to 2011 Census, the country has 1.01 crore children working in often risky industries such as brick kilns.. **Source: The week**
