#### DUBAI ROAD AND TRANSPORT AUTHORITY (RTA) LAUNCHES VIRTUAL ASSISTANT FOR ITS EMPLOYEES

The Roads and Transport Authority (RTA) recently launched a virtual assistant to respond to the needs and inquiries of its employees. The initiative is part of RTA's Digitisation Plan, that contributes to Dubai Paperless Strategy 2021 and supports the efforts of fighting COVID-19. The director of Administrative Services at RTA's Corporate Administrative Support Services Sector, Nabeel Al Ali, r, said: that The RTA has accomplished the automation of the entire administrative services to employees, which include 152 main services and 127 subsidiary services. The assistant has 132 programmed answers to potential questions from employees in various fields, Al Ali also explained that the RTA has also benefited from the artificial intelligence technology in launching a virtual assistant to respond to both Arabic employee inquiries in and English languages. #### ETHIOPIA GRANTED US\$14.85M GRANT FOR COVID 19 EDUCATION RESPONSE PROJECT

Ethiopia has received a US \$14.85 million grant from the Global Partnership for Education (GPE) to boost its response to disruptions in education caused by the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic. The World Bank will be the grant agent for Ethiopia: COVID-19 Education Response Project, which aims to maintain student learning while schools are closed, support the safe reopening of schools, and strengthen the resilience of the education system. To support the safe and effective reopening of schools, the project will, among other things, supply thousands of schools with sanitation and safety materials, conduct an extensive communication campaign to inform parents and students about available resources and re-opening procedures and establish an emergency helpdesk to report COVID-19 incidents. The project will also support distance learning activities during school closures and provide accelerated learning activities that will enable students to "catch-up" after schools reopen. #### **UAE GETS ITS FIRST CHINESE SCHOOL**

The first Chinese-curriculum school was inaugurated in a physically distanced ceremony by Sheikh Mansoor bin Mohammed, son of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid, Vice President and Ruler of Dubai. The school will enroll up to 2,000 pupils and will follow the model of Hangzhou No 2 High School, an internationally renowned school in Hangzhou, the capital of China's Zhejiang province. Following the national Chinese curriculum, the pupils will study Arabic, Islamic studies and moral education. School officials and teachers were recruited directly by Hangzhou Education Bureau. The school will focus on serving the 200,000 members of Dubai's Chinese community but will also accept pupils of other nationalities living in the emirate. The inauguration was held as the new academic year began. Schools across the country began allowing pupils back on campus from Sunday with safety measures in place to prevent the spread of Covid-19..
