## TRINITY COLLEGE, DUBLIN BRINGS SCHOLARSHIP WORTH 5 LAKH EUROS

Dublin's Trinity College on Friday launched the Engineering, Environment and Emerging Technologies scholarships worth 5 lakhs Euros for undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. The scholarships are open for applications for undergraduate and postgraduate offer holders in courses like Engineering, Natural Science and Computer Science and Statistics. Recognising the importance for humanity in addressing the challenge of sustainable technological development, the expansion of the three schools is being executed as a single strategic activity in the area of engineering, energy, and environment, Trinity College (Irish: Coláiste na Tríonóide), officially the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity of Queen Elizabeth near Dublin, is the sole constituent college of the University of Dublin, a research university located in Dublin, Ireland. The college was founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth I as "the mother of a university" that was modeled after the collegiate universities of Oxford and Cambridge, but unlike these affiliated institutions, only one college was ever established; as such, the designations "Trinity College" and "University of Dublin" are usually synonymous for practical purposes. **Source: India Today**

## FACEBOOK BACKS INDIAN EDUCATION STARTUP UNACADEMY

Unacademy, one of India's fastest growing education startups, has just received the backing of a major technology giant: Facebook. The startup said it will use the fresh capital to add more test prep categories, and on-board more teachers. Unacademy helps students prepare for competitive exams to get into a college and also those who are pursuing graduation-level courses. On its app, students watch live classes from educators and later engage in sessions to review topics in more detail. This is the second time Facebook is investing in an Indian startup.
